After 3 cup ties AFC Croydon Athletic returned to league action with a trip to Hollands & Blair on Saturday. They also returned to winning ways. Manager Kevin Rayner was forced to make changes as the Rams were 7 first team players short for various reasons. However the Rams put in an excellent performance and the scoreline didn't really give a true reflection of their dominance.

From the start the Rams were on the front foot. On 3 minutes the Rams had the ball in the net but were denied by an offside flag. Then on 8 minutes the Rams attacked and both Jonathan Paoluccio and Abbas Agoro had shots cleared off the line. Then 15 minutes a long clearance from Nic Taylor has flicked on by Nahum Green to Joe Nwoko but his shot went wide. On 19 minutes Taylor denied Peck but on 23 minutes the home side took the lead when Peck capitalised on hesitancy in the Rams defence to poke to ball past Taylor. The Rams hit back and Paoluccio passed to Nwoko who laid it to Bankole Koroma whose cross cum shot hit the bar. As half time approach first Taylor made a good save before Agoro fired a shot over the bar. So at half time the Rams went in unsure how they were 1-0 down.

The second half began with the Rams on the front foot and Paoluccio fired a shot from 30 yards, which had power and dip but clipped the bar. However on 64 minutes Billy Brown picked up the ball on the right, he cut inside beating two defenders before firing a cross shot into the bottom corner. Six minutes later Hollands were reduced to 10 men when their centre back was sent off but after 70 minutes it was 10 a side when Nahum Green was sent off too. The Rams continued to press for a winner. On 80 minutes Brown passed to Paoluccio who fired another dipping shot but it didn't dip enough. As the half neared its end Nwoko got free but shot wide. Then 3 minutes into stoppage time a ball was played into Nwoko, who went down under challenge and the referee awarded a penalty. Nwoko got up and despatched the penalty to give the Rams victory.

So Uckfield advance to the 3rd Round and the Rams will have to put their Wembley ambitions on hold for another season.

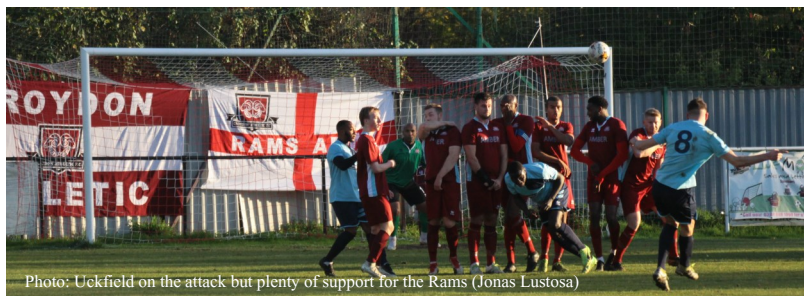

Their History...

The club was formed in 1882 as Chatham United, when Rochester Invicta merged with the football team of the Royal Engineers Band with the intention of creating a side that was capable of holding their own with the best in the country. Harry Hobart's plan being to bring together all the best players in the Medway Towns in one team. They played their first match on 7th October that year, beating Harley Street F.C. 4-0. Owing to their strong Army connections, Chatham soon moved to a regular home on "The Lines", where they were to remain until 1889 - the beginning of season 1889/90 seeing them move to "Alderman Winch's Enclosed Ground", or as it is now better known, the Maidstone Road Ground. Having been formed with an eye to competing in the F.A. Cup, they went on to reach the Quarter-Finals in 1888-89 - famously defeating Nottingham Forest after two replays, only to lose to the holders West Bromwich Albion. This game, which was played on "The Lines" where an admission fee could not be charged owing to Army regulations, was instrumental in the decision by the Football Association that all future matches in the competition must be played on fully enclosed grounds, where the visiting club would receive a share of the gate money.

Season 2010-11 saw the club struggle on the pitch with Manager Paul Foley resigning in the final weeks of the season with Player coach Kevin Watson taking over. After achieving some great results Kevin was appointed to his first Managerial position at the age of 30 after four seasons Kevin resigned following a run of poor results but left the club with a legacy of some very good players for the new incoming Manager Kevin Horlock in October 2015, Kevin stood down at the end of the season due his commitments with Colchester United, Tony Beckingham took over in the Summer of 2016, the club now back playing in Division 1 South of the Ryman League, for their second season, after four seasons in the North, Tony stood down as Manager in September 2016, Darren Anslow took over as Manager, after suffering some heavy defeats, Darren was relieved of his duties in November 2016 and Paul Piggott was installed as Manager. Despite a number of changes within the squad and some encouraging performances toward the end of the season, the damage had already been done and Paul and his team were unable to avoid the drop and The Chats were relegated to the SCEFL Premier. Despite this, changes at boardroom level revitalised the atmosphere around the club and a number of ground improvements have been undertaken as the first step in what will hopefully be a new era of success for the club. Following a disappointing start to the 2017/18 season and only 1 win in 8 league games, a management change was again instigated with Paul and his team being replaced in September 2017 with James Collins. James and his team improved the fortunes of the team immediately and within a few games had staved off the threat of relegation. 2 quarter final cup appearances were achieved, losing both on penalties. Despite a disappointing 16th place finish, there was room for optimism as exciting signings during the close season have built a team that promises an interesting 2018/19 season.

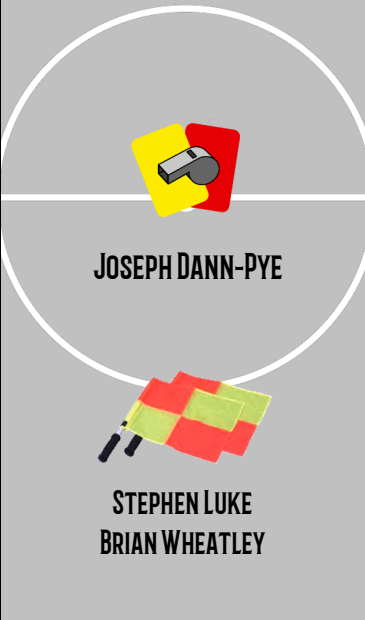
