

## TROWBRIDGE RFC FIRE AND EVACUATION

Trowbridge RFC gives fire safety the greatest priority where the main clubhouse building has a fire detection system installed.

In compliance with its statutory duties under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005, the club has a Fire Risk Assessment, which will be reviewed on an annual basis with fire exit and equipment awareness training given to all employees/ volunteers working on club premises.

Various fire fighting equipment is provided at strategic locations throughout the premises. It is the ethos of the club that fire fighting equipment is only to be used to aid means of escape during an emergency.

All fire exits, fire escape routes and access to fire fighting equipment must be kept clear from any obstructions at all times. Fire doors must never be wedges open.

All fire detection and fire fighting equipment will be inspected and maintained on an annual basis by a competent person. The alarm sounders are tested on a weekly basis and fire evacuation drill undertaken annually.

In the event of an incident requiring evacuation the fire alarm will sound. All club house users and spectators should then proceed to the primary muster point being the car park or the secondary point being the centre of pitch one and await further instructions / announcements.

All Clubhouse users and spectators are asked to remain calm and not panic. Please abide by these instructions as they have been prepared with the Emergency Services and your safety in mind.
